



## News from the Anglican Centre · August 2014

Greetings everyone,

Thank you for all the positive feedback following our recent leadership conference at Lake Rotoiti. I sincerely appreciated the time together and am grateful to Graham O'Brien who carries the burden for all the organising and planning for this event. The venue was great and the input from John Gray was both challenging and encouraging, particularly so because it comes from a practitioner - it is formed from his own experience. Sincere thanks also to the Waimea Parish for taking responsibility for breakfast and lunch and to Ruth and Tim Ellena and their team for the children's ministry.

Felicity and Aubrey Whitcombe have accepted a position in the parish of Kaiapoi within the Christchurch Diocese and finished at the Cathedral last Sunday. This move enables Felicity and Aubrey to be closer to family which is something they feel that they need to do at this time. They have both had a significant ministry in the years they have been a part of the Diocese and I know that they will certainly miss the ethos and atmosphere of the Diocese of Nelson. In the last few years Felicity has also been a Canon of the Cathedral and the Regional Dean of Nelson and she has brought strong pastoral care and concern to this role. I will certainly miss their support and encouragement but wish them every blessing in this move.

Please keep Rev Ian and Karen Thatcher in your prayers as Ian awaits surgery that has just been postponed to the 25th August. This waiting period has been very unsettling for Ian and Karen and (personally - considering the symptoms Ian is experiencing) I think it is unacceptable. Please pray for the time of waiting and for the skills of the specialists and surgeons who are caring for him.

My own (relatively minor) surgery that is a follow up to my recent stint in hospital happens next week and will put me on 'go slow' for another week or so. I have really appreciated the prayer from so many.

Congratulations to Jonathan and Lucy Wasley who were married up at the lake the weekend after our clergy and lay conference. We certainly wish them every blessing in their marriage. Jonathan's ordination - together with the ordinations of Victoria Askin and Jean Palmer (to the Priesthood) will now be happening at the Synod service in October. Congratulations also to Steve Wockner who celebrated 25 years of ordained ministry a couple of weeks ago. The Church at St Johns in Westport had a great crowd for a special celebration.

I am also grateful for your encouragement for our Diocesan decision to commit ourselves to the process established by General Synod that will consider how we might hold ourselves in unity when the proposals that some Dioceses would want to see the Church are in opposition to the clear teaching of scripture.

It is the issue of the authority of scripture that is creating so much heat from those who identify with the evangelical ethos of this Diocese.

Please hold those involved in the process in your prayers over these next months, particularly the Rev Dr Andrew Burgess who is a member of the General Synod working group on this issue.

Over 130 people in the diocese have attended training sessions since this safety system for all those in ministry was mandated at synod. This is a great start. We still have a long way to go to full implementation. Thank you to those deaneries and parishes that have been proactive in recruiting a coordinator. Training for these people will begin in September.

The implementation and training has raised a number of issues that have required some re organisation of specific roles and reporting systems to fit our diocese. This is a 'work in progress' which will be completed prior to the POMD training of modules 3 & 4 set for September.

Another issue is the training of hospitality and technical volunteers who require training but for whom the full day sessions contain far more information than they need. It is my intention to write a short version, taking approximately 1.5hrs, for this group of volunteers. I envisage that this training will ultimately be run in parishes, by the coordinator, on an as and when required basis.

As part of the implementation of 'Safe Here' each ministry will be required to write a safety plan. This will cover the day to day running of each ministry. To assist parishes templates will be provided to cover various ministries and events.

No doubt I will be sharing with groups around the Diocese some of the benefits of my Sabbatical but if you would like to book me to do this in your parish, please get in touch. If I came back with any message buzzing in my mind it is that as those who are Baptised into God the Trinity we ALL have a ministry to fulfil, and that includes our oldest members.
